SEASONAL GROWING GUIDE

Follow this guide to help plant and grow throughout the year!



LET'S GET GROWING!

This resource is your go-to for planting, caring, and harvesting the the food you'll grow. Explore essential tips for planting and detailed care instructions for each crop you will receive. Get ready to watch your garden thrive!

WATERING :

- Gently water your garden at least once per day for about 2 weeks after you plant. The top of the soil needs to stay moist for seeds to sprout.
- After the first 2 weeks, water your plants every 1-2 days.

GARDENING TERMS:

- Sow: Planting seeds in the ground.
- Thin: Once seeds start to sprout, thin them by gently removing some sprouts. This gives individual plants more space to grow.
- Perennial: A plant that lives more than two years.

SOIL FERTILITY:

- Use organic fertilizer every 30 days, applying approximately 3 tablespoons at the base of plants in each garden bed. Water the fertilizer into the soil.
- Rotate the location of food crops from season to season to reduce disease and pests.

GROWING SEASONS

Planting & harvesting may vary due to the garden placement, plant care and your local climate.

COOL

Early spring, late fall, & winter in warmer climates or places where plants can overwinter.

WARM

Spring, early fall, & winter in warm climates or places where plants can overwinter.

HOT

Summer, and/or late spring, & early fall in warmer climates.

PLANTING GUIDE

The information in this guide will help you know how to space and plant seeds in your garden and time your harvest.

ICON KEY:



Row Spacing (in inches): how much space is needed between rows.



Seed Depth (in inches): how deep in the soil seed should be planted.



Seed Spacing (in inches): how far apart seeds should be planted.

PLANTING LAYOUTS

Below are various crop planting layouts for your garden beds.

● Growing individual plants. Sow 2-3 seeds & thin the weakest sprouts. Space about 6" apart.





ROW SPACING:

☀ Growing individual plants that need more space. Sow 2-3 seeds & thin the weakest sprouts. Space 10-15" apart.




ROW SPACING:

SMALL GARDEN BEDS




LARGE GARDEN BEDS







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

HOT SEASON

SUMMER COVER CROPS



CROP	COVER CROP TIPS
 Peas Oats Vetch	During off-seasons, this cover crop mix maintains garden vibrancy and suppresses weeds. Oat and flower stalks support nitrogen-enriching pea and vetch vines. Plant in spring,
 Calendula	incorporate into soil in fall. (Enjoy sweet treats from pea flowers.) Prevent self-seeding by killing plants before seed formation.
 Zinnia	Leave as mulch or turn into soil for decomposition.
